

"The Carpathian mountains – the land of migratory fishes"

On 27th February 2020 in the Sanok District took place a meeting of representatives of working groups from the project entitled "The Carpathian mountains – the land of migratory fishes".

The main purpose of the meeting was to discuss the changes made in the project, presentation of a new project coordinator from the Ukrainian side and specifying the conference organization details and also the implementation of a promotional and educational film.

The project partners also discussed about materials and printouts of a popular science publication.

In the meeting took part as follows Stanisław Chęć, Starost of the Sanok District, Janusz Cecuła, Vice - Starost of the Sanok District, Wojciech Skiba, project manager, Sebastian Koń, assistant of project manager, Jolanta Weremińska, financial specialist and Renata Ryniak, chief accountant.

The Ukrainian project partner was represented by Igor KOC, Head of the District Council in Zhydachiv, Віра Янклевич, member of the District Council in Zhydachiv, Бовкіт ІГОР, project coordinator and also Мирошкін Володимир and Міцзяк Богдан – representatives of the fire brigade from Zhydachiv.

"The Carpathian mountains - the land of migratory fishes" project is a joint promotion of the unique on an international scale migrations and spawning grounds of fishes in streams and mountain rivers in the Sanok District and in the Zhydachiv District.

As a part of the project, four cross-border events will take place, including two conferences and two trainings - says Stanisław Chęć, Starost of the Sanok District.

A publication will also be created to promote the nature of mountain streams and rivers in the support area, and a film about the migration of common nase to spawning grounds located in the upper parts of mountain streams. The publication and film will be implemented by the Sanok District with the support of the project partner from Ukraine.

A total budget of the project "The Carpathian mountains - the land of migratory fishes" is 59 899.61 Euro, of which 90% of funds are financed by the European Union from the Poland-Belarus-Ukraine Cross-Border Cooperation Program 2014-2020.
